
Why should you start a plastic surgical training program in Sumatra any way?

Well eh....

Sumatra has 48 million inhabitants

With a birth rate of 18.2 per 1000 and an incidence of cleft lip/palate of 1:600 this counts for 1245 new cases each year

There are at this very moment 12 plastic surgeons active in Sumatra



We calculated that there are still 30.000 people with clefts awaiting treatment in Sumatra alone


This man waited 63 years (No moneyNo access)



Just another reason to start a plastic surgical training

2. There are 15.000 new cases of Intra oral carcinoma in Indonesia, and only 100 plastic surgeons

 The preferred treatment is combined radiotherapy, oncological resection of the tumor and reconstruction.



And yet an other reason

- 4. Motorbike accidents account for 80% of all maxillo-facial trauma and is a fast growing health expenditure in Indonesia
 - treatment is often delayed due to lack of capacity and available know how
 - an increasing number of patients have severe soft tissue and peripheral nerve injury
 - there are only 8 plastic surgeons in Medan



Flame burns account for 40% off all plastic surgical trauma cases



- Due to malpractice of kerosene sellers who are mixing petrol and kerosene, flame burns are frequent, affecting mainly women and children
- In Medan alone plastic surgeons are confronted with 10 to 20 cases of severe burns up to 60% every month
- The biggest teaching hospital has a burn's unit of 2 beds

Progress of the program

- 2009 MOU between USU, Harapan Jaya Rehabilitation Center and Erasmus MC.
- 2010 feasibility study by dr Jan E Sluimers.
- 2011 MOA between all parties involved
- 2011 Official meeting between the Dean of USU and the Dean of Indonesia University. and signing of MOA
- Rector of USU signed official letter to open Plastic surgical training.
- Renewed request by the rector to the KKI

planned visitation by Indonesia Medical Counsil and Plastic Surgery Collegium. Letter to this effect received by the ministry of education on 24 th april 2013

Definite letter of agreement to open the program study under the guidance of the UI on the first of january 2014

"Start" of the training program on January 1st 2014

- 6 year training program, 2 years general surgery and 4 years plastic surgery.
- Module structure of the curriculum.
- Acceptance of 4 resident per year.
- 3-4 times a year guest lectures for 2-4 week depend on the module topics.
- Yearly examination on knowledge and skills progress.

Now back to reality




- There are still no residents in training

 During the negotiations we became aware that only 2 out of 6 possible teachers were qualified to train plastic surgical residents


"Heads, you failed to learn. Tails, I failed to teach."

3 Residents don't get a salary but have to pay a heavy tuition fee



This results in an income based selection and not in an recruitment based on skills, knowledge, dedication and interest

There is a certain sense of rivalry between the two isles Java and Sumatra

- Although there is a free and frequent exchange of plastic surgical residents the general attitude towards Medan is one of reservedness


The road to succes
